Pastoral Letter of the Right Reverend John Arnold Bishop of Salford to the Children of the Diocese

To be read in all Schools in the week in the week commencing 11th October 2021

My Dear Young People,

You may remember that I wrote to you at the Feast of Pentecost about some important events that are happening in 2021, one of them being a meeting called **COP 26**.

Beginning on 1st November until 12th November in Glasgow, over 200 world leaders will meet for COP26, to discuss <u>climate</u> <u>change</u>.

At **COP26** governments and leaders from across the world will discuss and set targets to try to **reduce greenhouse gases** and **protect the planet**. The decisions made at this meeting will affect people all over the globe helping us all to work together to look after our common home.

What is climate change?

Climate change (or global warming), is the process of our planet heating up. Climate change affects all living things – plants, animals, oceans, forests, human beings.

The Earth is God's gift to us, full of beauty and wonder it belongs to all of us and we all have responsibility to look after this precious gift.

As we prepare for **COP26**, I would like you to try to do some or even all the ideas below:

- Find out some more facts about **COP26** and tell people in your school, class, family members and people in your neighbourhood why this meeting is so important *you could make posters or a video to give this important information.*




Take time to pray, giving thanks for the beautiful world we live in. Take time to pray that world leaders and governments will make the right decisions to help everyone in our global family.
